PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE MARCH 2024

We have continued work on emergency equipment and preparedness. The new generator is now operational with the emergency village hall wiring installed. We will be testing the full system shortly. We have also signed up for a very worthwhile initiative by Wiltshire Council: the Emergency Hub Scheme. This will connect our village hall community "hub" to the emergency services and allow 2 way support.

On the planning front, we have been looking at the new Tisbury Neighbourhood Plan (TisPlan2). From a village perspective this is a positive step and we have commented accordingly. There is still time for individual comment until 22 March via <u>www.tisplan.org.uk</u> if you wish.

Patrick Willis has now retired as a Parish councillor. Our thanks for his contribution including oversight of the restoration of the phone box as well as many local footpath improvements. We seek a replacement both for him and for our Locum Parish Clerk - do please contact me if you would like further details.

You weren't wrong - it was indeed WET, WET, WET!

Gerry Blundell, our resident rainfall expert reports:

2023 was Swallowcliffe's wettest year this century with over 1.3 metres of rain. This trend has continued in 2024, February saw 143 mm (5.6 inches), double the average. The impact of so much water is plain: repeated flooding of Bottom Lane and the Three Bridges at Tisbury Station. Last week a sink hole appeared at the top end of Tisbury High Street. Past records show that +1 metre years almost always come in groups of two or three..... so we may well see more of the same in 2024.
