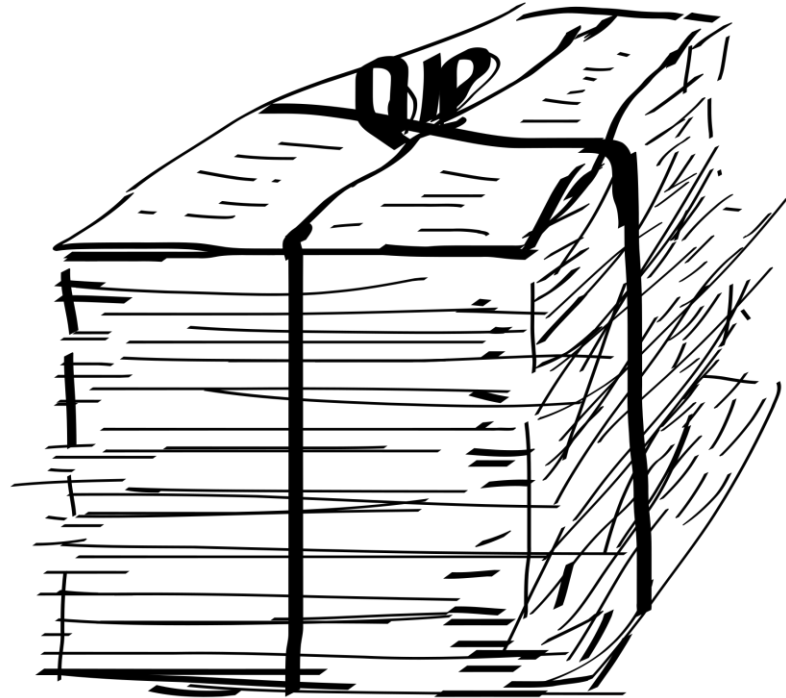

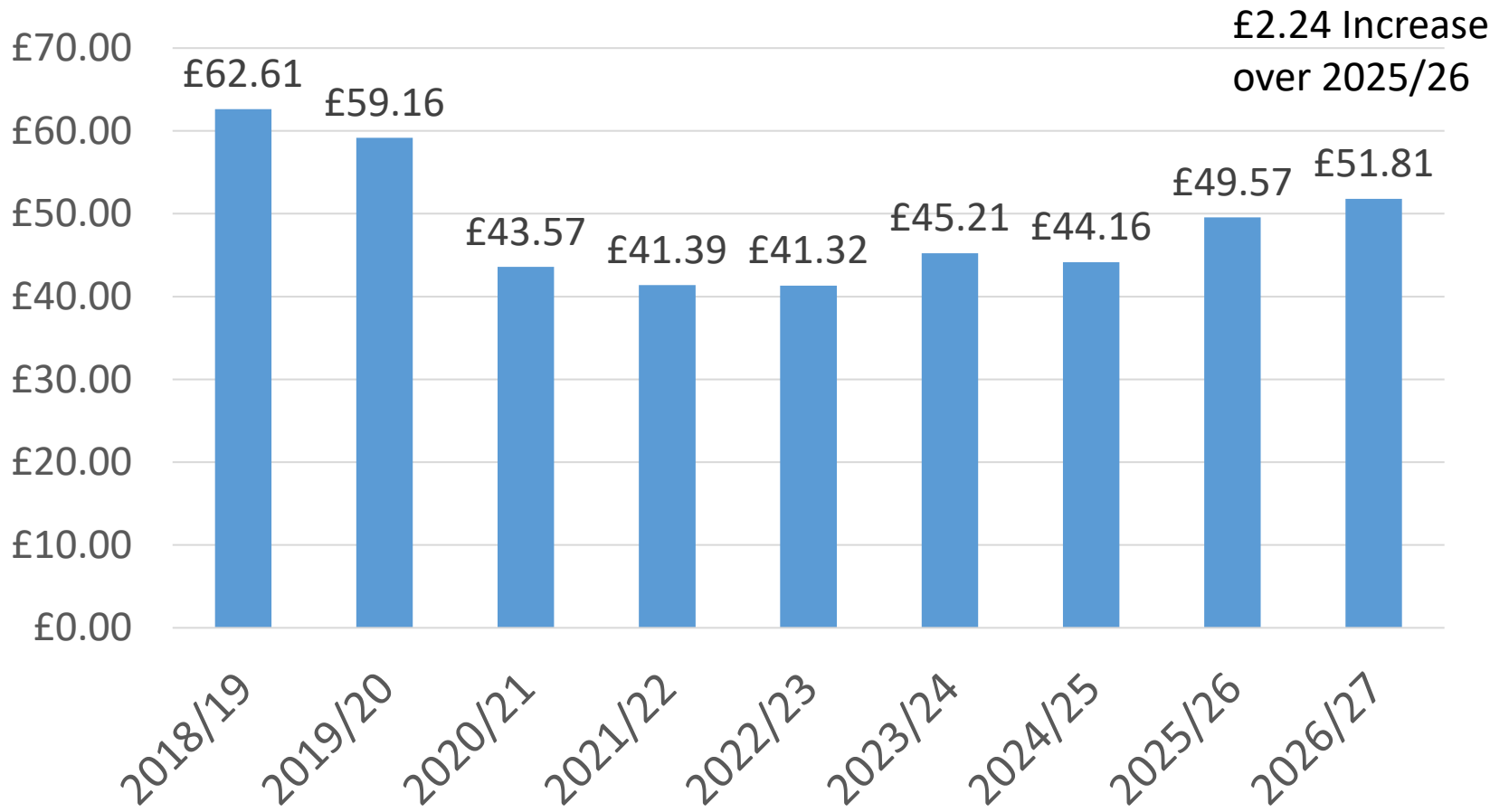

Resident Council Tax Contribution for 2026/27

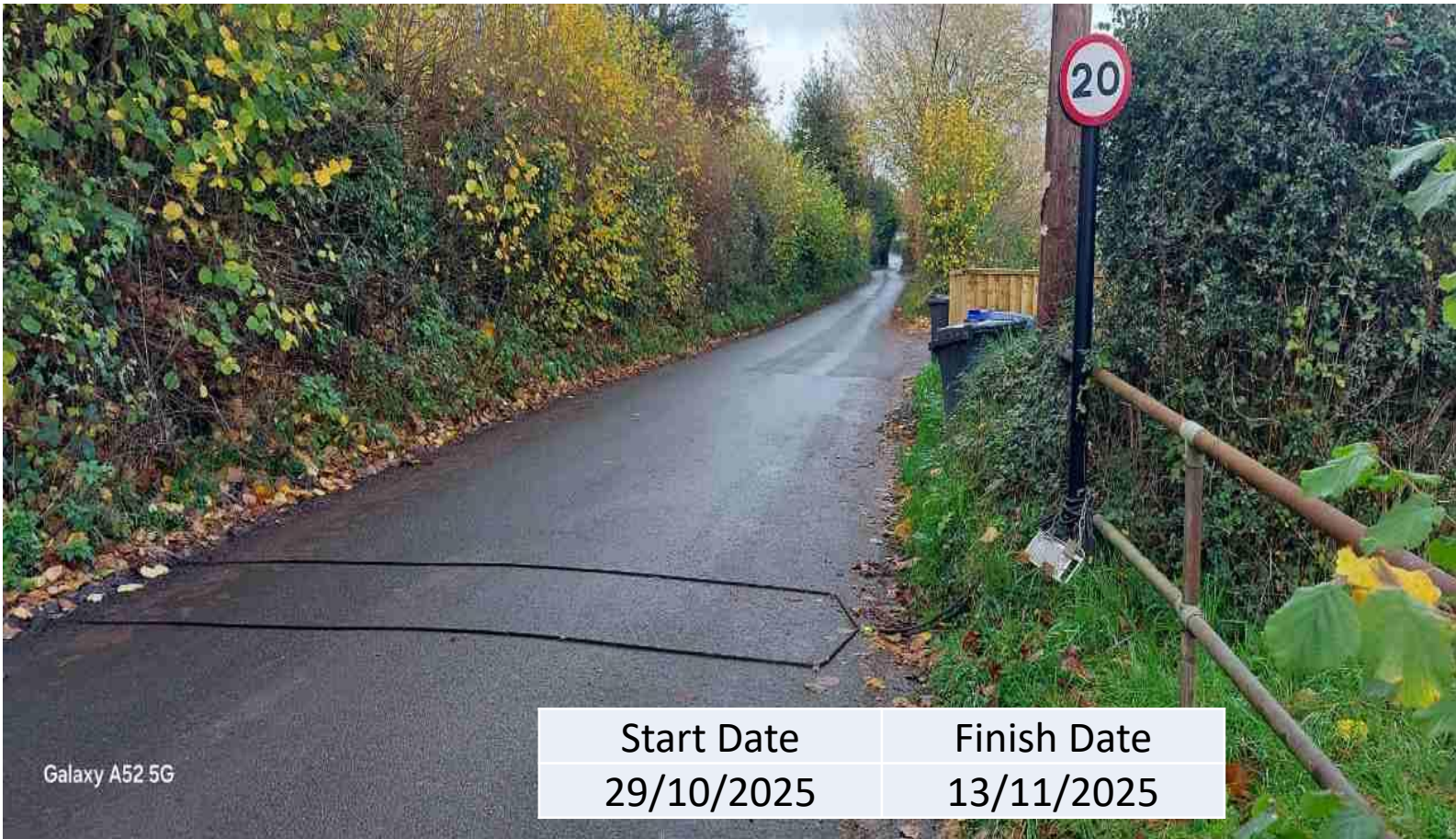

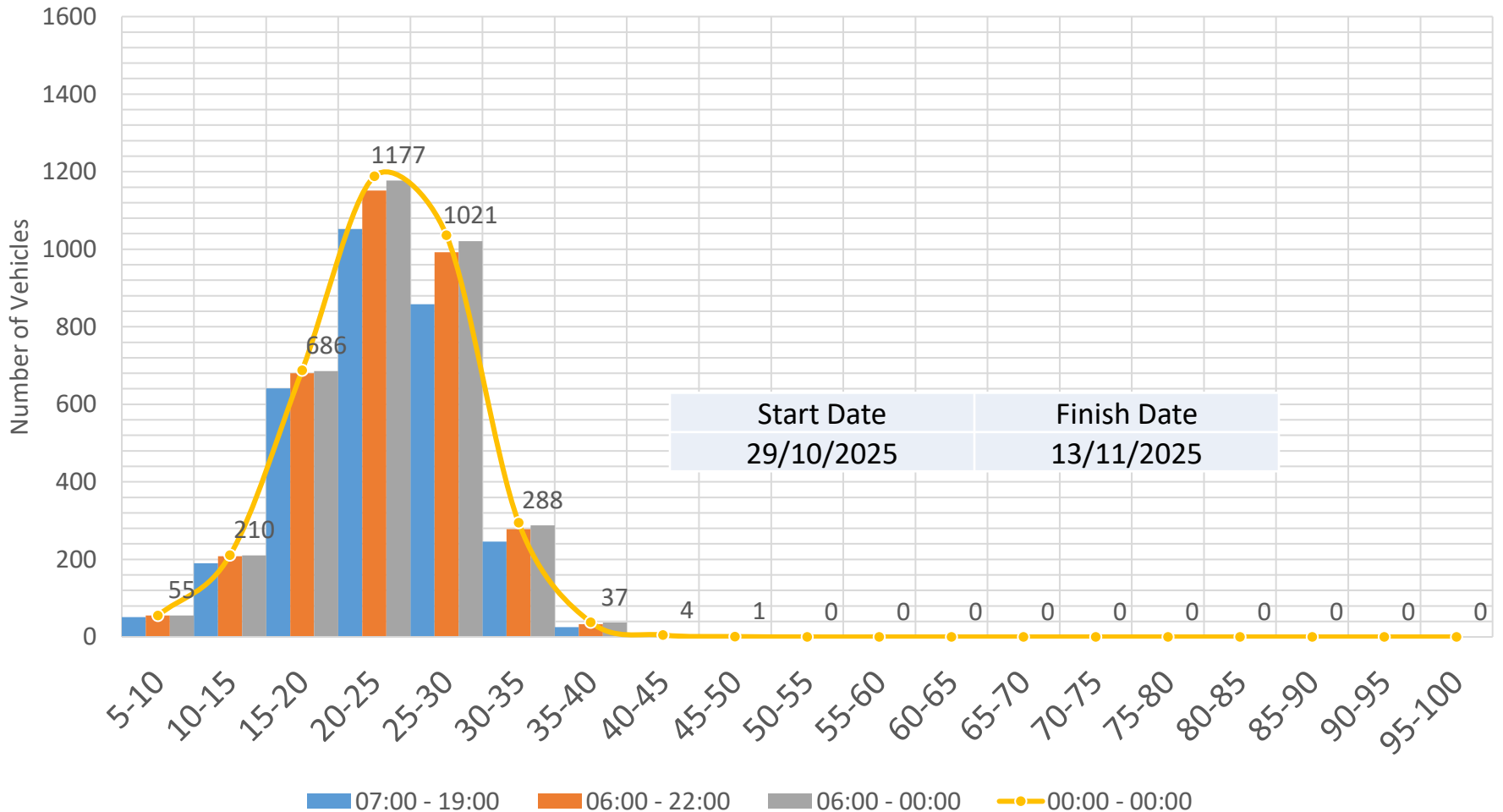
Rookery Lane Speed Survey

Options

“The results of the survey indicate that overall, the 20mph speed limit remains appropriate for the section of Swallowcliffe surveyed but a minor speeding issue is considered to exist” – Wiltshire Council Highways

In Wiltshire on a road subject to a 20mph speed limit, the following criteria is applied:

- 85th percentile speed is between 20mph and 24mph = No Further Action
- 85th percentile speed is between 24.1mph and 38.9mph = Eligible for Community Speed Watch or Deployment of Speed Indicator Device
- 85th percentile speed is over 39mph = Subject to Police enforcement or considered for traffic calming

AI Prediction of SID effect

- **Measured:**
- *Mean speed: 22.71 mph*
- *85th percentile: 28.03 mph*
- **Expected after SID installation:**
- *Mean speed likely drops to around 20–21.5 mph*
- *85th percentile speed likely drops to around 23–26 mph*
- *but it probably won't fully control the **fastest drivers** without additional measures*
 - *We had 10 drivers doing 40-45 mph and 2 doing 45-50 mph!*
